
Ashley Dyer - Associate Artist 2021/2022

When successful his work breaks new ground, is unconventional, often experiential, transdisciplinary. He has created and performed in works around Australia and in Asia and Europe.

He works very slowly. His practice consists largely of asking questions and solving personal riddles in order to discover better questions and new riddles. His work is heavily influenced by artists, groups and performances that emerged out of Sydney's Performance Space between 1985 and 2005. Some of those artists and their work he knows personally and others he knows through hearsay, mythology and oral tradition. Since the beginning of 2017, aside from the odd remount, his public practice has lain dormant, instead working at Dancehouse as their Program Manager.
